



Leadership: £4,300,000

56 *Time to Shine Leaders
£1,400,000

*A leadership programme for people who are just starting their career in the social sector through a 12-month full-time paid position within a Rank Network charitable organisation in the UK.

15 *Rank Aspire Leaders
£377,000

*Through RAP, we invest in young people aged 18 to 24 who may have fewer opportunities to prosper than their peers and empower them to develop leadership skills for social good.

67 *School Leadership Awards Holders
£288,000

*Rank offers financial support to Sixth Form students who are identified to have outstanding leadership potential. Each year, they will participate in a Community Action Placement at Rank Network member organisations.

>100 Roles across *Start Here Programme (NI)
£2,200,000

*Start Here is skills and employment programme for the Voluntary, Community & Social Enterprise (VCSE) and sports sectors in Northern Ireland. The Rank Foundation was appointed to deliver the programme since 2022, with £9,900,000 funding from the Department for Communities Northern Ireland.



10 Funded Places within *Profit for Good, totalling
£293,000

*Profit for Good increases enterprise in the social sector by helping participants generate sustainable income and supporting leaders of profit-for-good initiatives to be agile and confident.

Enterprise: £1,200,000

Education Recovery Fund, totalling
£288,000

- 10 Year 12 students from disadvantaged backgrounds will benefit from summer science research placements over the next 3 years.
- 6 UK schools will develop the 'cradle to career' educational provision model during the same timeframe.
- 8 care-experienced children will be supported through secondary school by the Broadening Educational Pathways programme.

*The repayable grants programme continues to support local social enterprises and community businesses in Plymouth, giving them the confidence to seek and repay investment as part of building sustainable futures in changing and challenging times. So far, around £380,000 has been granted to 5 organisations, from an initial funding pot of £220,000.



Faith: £1,300,000

Rank's founder was a committed Methodist and today we aim to convene conversations about faith in all its forms. Across TV, Audio and Digital, Rank's subsidiary CTVC promotes the principles, history, education, and practice of the Christian faith from a perspective of all faiths and none.

CTVC 2023 faith output in numbers:

- 48 World faiths, moral and ethical themed programmes LIVE.
- 99 further Christian, world faiths, moral and ethical programmes in production
